HOLDING THE CONSCIOUSNESS

SURPRISE!! You cannot imagine how surprised I was when Robert Quintana Hopkins invited me to consider being East Bay Church's Interim Minister. You cannot imagine how amazed I am... LIFE is calling me to be an energy of healing and supportive love to you, whom I've enjoyed and cherished for such a long time.

Many of you don't know that I've had quite a long and circuitous relationship with East Bay Church of Religious Science's community. Right now, I am sharing some of the story of my journey with East Bay. I believe my story may be an inspiring example of how Spirit nudges us along our spiritual path... guides us to expand and grow when we're willing to say, YES!!!

Here's my story and my commitment to YOU! Beloved Community!

I started my journey with Science of Mind (SOM) philosophy during the late 1960s. Oh, I enjoyed being inspired by the *Science of Mind* magazine for ten years... then, one day, I set out to find people who thought like the ideas I read in the magazine. Yes! One Saturday morning, I found the First Church of Religious Science (now Oakland Center) — the only SOM church in Oakland (at the time). In hindsight, I must admit I felt inspired by Rev. Lillian Hopper's vibrant spiritual talks.

Yet, I didn't feel at home. I

missed Amens! Gospel singing and shouting! Sermon's with the fervor and soulful cadence! Bible stories illuminating what we must do to work with others to stand against oppressive and unjust experiences – like my Mother described when she had to train her own supervisor at Oakland's Naval Supply Center! No wonder Mom was so dynamic – walking and talking, Paul Lawrence Dunbar's An Antebellum Sermon, a dramatic reading reminding all of us, God said, "Go down Moses - Tell Ole Pharaoh, Let my people go!" Yes, I was inspired by the SOM teaching, but, I missed the rhythm of St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church, founded in my grandparents' Berkeley home three years before I was born.

I left First Church. Soon, I found and became a member of Rev. Dr. Hazaiah William's Church. And I got involved in Berkeley Unified School District (BUSD) politics. Sacred service for this religious community was focused on our minister's charge

as BUSD Board President and as founder of the Center for Urban Black Studies. We attended many talks delivered by Rev. Williams' friend and mentor, the mystic, Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman. We were most inspired while visiting in his home in San Francisco. Oh! I was learning so much - talking with union leaders, walking precincts, and sitting on Board committees. And yet, I began to feel squeezed. I soon realized that I didn't know how to manage my personal affairs and I needed help!!!

I took my first SOM class at the Masonic Temple with East Bay's Rev. Dr. Ernie Forks. Years later, I sang in East Bay's choir, guided by the musical genius of Tyrone Cosey! While I attended ministerial school, East Bay Church was led by Rev. Amon, who asked me to be Board Chair. Immediately, I said YES!!! When he left, we hired another minister – just before Dr. Margaret Stortz asked me to serve as First Church's Assistant Minister over Youth and Family. During this time, I launched the annual Multicultural Unity Month Celebration. Then, I joined Dr. Lloyd Tupper as Curriculum Coordinator for Ernest Holmes College in Sausalito, California. Soon, I decided to start my own spiritual center; and, to my amazement, within a few

months, I became minister of East Bay. And, with the help of Eleanor Grier, Helen Anderson. and Wendy Worsely, I enjoyed growing East Bay from 12 to 35 members and moving into Bjornson Hall.

My personal life got in the way of my ministry and I felt compelled to help my sons enter college. Immediately, I returned to continue my 25 years as a National External Educational Change Agent — guiding teachers in 18 school districts to infuse culturally diverse activities into reading, writing and language arts activities for children and parents.

I was so thankful Rev. E. said Yes! She awakened East Bay Church. With her wisdom, insight and spiritual strength, Rev. E grew East Bay's membership to thousands. Several years later, I was called back into ministerial service at the San Francisco Church of Religious Science. There, I had the joy of serving as minister to members of the LGBTO, Latinx and Hunters Point Communities. To my surprise, while visiting many in hospice care, my passion to use artistic expression for spiritual healing was reawakened.

Years later, while teaching ministerial students using a room in East Bay's offices, Rev. E asked me to return to East Bay to lead the Youth and Family Ministry and create a Bible

class. While developing and teaching the CSL-certificated Bible Wisdom, I led students in a joyful movement activity with the song, "I Want to Fly"... and my soul took the song seriously! Within a few months, I was flying right to San Diego. Yes, launching a new career as Holmes Institute's Southern California Regional Dean. Then



whisk! Before I knew it, Rev.
Michael Beckwith and the
Institute's Board asked me to
be the Director of Education
to ensure ministerial students
would obtain an accredited
Masters Degree in Consciousness
Studies. Oh, beloveds, I enjoyed
teaching wonderful classes like
Metaphysical Bible or Spiritual
Psychology. And I loved creating
classes such as Diversity and
Painting Dreams.

A year ago, I found myself stepping into a NEW WORLD!! Like the painting of my owlheaded astronaut stepping from dwelling on one planet or state of consciousness into a new reality. Or as the Consciousness the Master Teacher declaring, "Not My Will... but Thine Be
Done!!!" As my soul singing, "I
had a revelation, one day when I
was in prayer!" As my Sister Rev.
E frequently exclaims, "I don't
know what I'm doing!" and then
brilliant wonders fall out of her
mouth and wisdom emerges
through her actions!

In this NEW WORLD I declare, Beloveds! In the midst of these pandemics, COVID-19 and Black Lives Matter, I, FranCione am here: to listen, pray and vision with you!

THE LABYRINTH: MY SPIRITUAL LADDER

In these times pregnant with opportunities for growth, where Herculean faith and steadfastness is required,

spiritual practice is one that supports your inward journey of self-exploration...beyond the five senses to experience the Spirit, God, or soul within us."

My daily practices of Spiritual
Mind Treatment and meditation
have transfigured my journey in

over 15 years ago — walking the
labyrinth. Awhile back, I took
a women's spirituality course
that required students find a
"new" spiritual tool to bring into

daily practice. I remembered the elevating experience of walking a portable labyrinth during a Science of Mind gathering at Asilomar in Pacific Grove, California. So, I decided that I would bring a daily labyrinth walk into my spiritual practices.

I have learned that walking a labyrinth is a journey on a path toward wholeness and authenticity. The goal is to reach the center, the Self, the core of one's being. I also learned that there are different types of Remember. Before I enter the labyrinth, I remember all that I have to be grateful for as I bring forth any challenge I may have. My focus is on healing.

Release. As I walk the labyrinth, I release and let go of mind chatter. I allow myself to be at one with each step as I breathe into the experience.

Receive. As I step into the center, I stand in this safe place in full communion with my soul, ready to receive. I am open at


the top, listening for and feeling the inner tugging of the Divine within the depths of my soul.

Return. As I walk through the "legs" of the labyrinth and exit where I started, I experience a deeper understanding,

My spiritual practice of walking a labyrinth is climbing my spiritual ladder. Each time I gift myself with this healing tool, I am perched on a sweet cloud of inner peace knowing that all is well.

I recall the all-male leadership model of my corporate years. It utilized force and the power of the "carrot and stick" and was driven by ego, politics and cronyism. Work was conducted in a culture of leveraged intimidation and fear with fixed deadlines and timetables!

Female Leadership is not new in America and it's not new to me!

As a child growing up in the Jim Crow South, I closely watched adults interacting with one another. I wanted to learn who was in charge and what they could teach me. I noticed and studied my (4'10") grandmother, "Mama B.". Though she was tiny at 4'10", she directed larger and louder people without raising her voice. People followed her precise direction in completing

women to be as capable, if not more, capable than men, even when women cloak their abilities as a strategy of power. That is especially true for Southern women who quietly teach other women skills of adaptability, tenacity, strength, grit, discernment and encouragement.

As more and more women build their power circles and unify

their leadership skills, they are taking the opportunity to exercise those talents, skills and abilities through the consciousness "filter" of problems and challenges, transforming problems into leadership opportunities! Again, consider and view problems as your possibility of leadership and power!

Finally consider ignoring bad advice and bad people. Even though many seem to view our world as one saddled with too many problems and challenges to handle, this is a time of opportunity!

The judicial system is broken but this man, who is now 57 years of age, is not angry with anyone. He just wants his freedom. I have been a connection to the outside world

> for him and a support that says you are not alone. We have talked about God and prayed together and prayed for one another. His faith in God has grown stronger and I have encouraged him as well as he has

We call ourselves
the Beacon of Light Prison
Ministry and we originally
came together to support all in
the East Bay community who

the years, our ministry has
grown and we now partner
with like-minded organizations
committed to being a light in

COVID-19 has compelled us to reset. It has dramatically

reduced our commutes from several miles to a few feet as we live, work, eat, entertain and rest at home. Here are a few tips to make the most of your stay at home.




