At **When We All Vote**, we like to remind folks that every year is an election year — and we've got a HUGE election going on right now in the Golden State.

Right now, Governor Gavin Newsom is facing a recall election — the state's second ever gubernatorial recall election. If over 50% of voters vote "Yes" in the recall election, Governor Gavin Newsom will be removed from office and replaced by whichever candidate wins the most votes.

From the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic response to the climate emergency, the outcome of the recall election will determine how California will respond to every issue impacting its nearly 40 million residents.

We know that the process of casting a ballot in this recall election might be unfamiliar, so we've broken down the voting process and answered a few questions you might have about the upcoming recall election.

• How are ballots being distributed to California voters?

Every registered voter in the state of California has already been mailed a ballot for the gubernatorial recall election.

• If I haven't been mailed a ballot to my current address, is there a way to vote inperson?

Voters can still register to vote in-person conditionally at their polling location through Election Day, which means your ballot will be processed and counted once elections officials verify your registration. Make your plan to vote-in person and find your elections office here.

FIND YOUR POLLING PLACE

• What will be on my gubernatorial recall ballot, and how do I complete my ballot? There's just two questions on the ballot:

Question #1: "Shall Gavin Newsom be recalled from the Office of Governor?"

A "no" vote keeps the Governor in office.

A "yes" vote removes the Governor from Office.

Question #2: "Candidates to succeed Gavin Newsom as Governor if he is recalled?"

If you want the current governor to remain in office, vote "NO" on Question #1 and either ignore Question #2, or vote for the candidate you'd like to see replace him should the recall succeed.

If you want the current governor removed, vote "YES" on Question #1 and vote for the person you'd like to see replace him should the recall succeed on question #2.

How do I return my completed ballot?

You must mail or drop-off your completed mail-in ballot at an approved drop-off site before polls close on September 14th. You can find your closest drop-off location here.

• I've already completed and returned my ballot. Now what?

If you have already mailed your ballot or returned it to a drop-off location, <u>you can track your ballot here!</u>

And remember, every single vote makes a difference! Make sure your friends, family, and community members make a plan to vote in the recall election.
